Community, chaos and summer camps

Earlier this year, we launched our Little Brick of Little Books – a brand-new tool for ministries that need quality, Bible-centred resources that people will read, re-read, and keep. Clare Doughty from Lifewords took a Little Brick to a youth camp she was leading on this summer:

"Every day I ran the 'super chill' option during the afternoon, giving the young people the chance to take a break from the higher energy activities and relax, do something crafty, play a game, or read. Alongside the friendship bracelets, board games, macramé and clay sat the Little Brick, and many young people were intrigued by this vibrant and exciting resource. One camper, who was heading to university at the end of the summer, took one of each Little Book. She wanted to decorate her student room with the Bible verses that the Little Books held.

"Another youth leader recognised the Little Books instantly. She shared that, when she was going through a really hard time as a student, a friend had sent her copies of *Little Book of Chaos*, a resource which focusses on the experience of mental illness, and that it had brought her great comfort. Since then, she has been sharing copies of *Little Book of Chaos* with other friends who are in difficult seasons of life."

New opportunities in Indonesia

For the last five years, Indonesia has been in the process of moving its capital city from Jakarta to Nusantara. Jakarta has become crowded, polluted, and is sinking due to the over-extraction of groundwater and its location on swampy land. Gunar Sahari explains how Lifewords is using the establishment of this new city as an opportunity for mission:

"We are conducting ministry to various locations where servants of God are serving around the new national capital in East Kalimantan. The 'mobile mission' to Indonesia's new capital, Nusantara, focuses on supporting the development of this important city. The mission provides essential resources and support to these areas, collaborating with the local communities to improve living conditions and offer services such as clean water, healthcare, and education to help the community thrive. This mission is a crucial component of the plan to establish Nusantara as a successful and sustainable new capital for Indonesia."

Gunar and the "mobile mission" team travelled to various locations, meeting with pastors and church leaders for prayer, training and support. "The training included sessions for discussion, sharing experiences, and praying together," says Gunar. "The focus was on learning how to share the gospel effectively. Participants talked about different ways to spread the message and supported each other with advice and prayers. This time together helped everyone feel more prepared and confident in their mission to share their faith."

Pavement Project in Guinea-Bissau

Last year, Pavement Project launched in the small country of Guinea-Bissau on the coast of West Africa. Marli Santos Oliveira, a Brazilian missionary working with Evangelical Missionary Linguistic Association / Wycliffe talks about how she and others are seeing children impacted by God's Word:

"Guinea-Bissau has an estimated population of almost two million inhabitants made up of a diversity of ethnic groups, each with its own religious rituals, ethics, festivals, and culture.

"In one Pavement Project counselling session, I met Lúcia*, who told me about a leader in her community who is revered to have spiritual knowledge and power. For Lúcia, he was a confusing and scary figure. During the session, she told me that in her mind, the spiritual leader transforms into a black cat, appearing to her every day on the way to school. After sharing and praying, Lúcia received a Bible pocket card, and left feeling less afraid. A week later, I noticed she was different. I asked her if she was still afraid of the man, and she said: 'Didn't you tell me that Jesus would protect me, and I didn't need to be afraid anymore? Every night, I read my card and put it under my pillow.'"
